Cindy wants to spread mulch in the pollinator garden on April 12. Wheelbarrow workers and use of redwood fine chips is needed We could put on the white board tasks to do if you need independent work. Cindy suggests a tool outside the shed for easy access. Mary W suggests a yearly work day calendar. The entire pollinator garden is weeded for now. The drip system needs a timer and connector to the drip system. The committee will hand water for now.

G. Mulch, Cardboard, Pathways, Manure Lynn Kaminski Lynn looked up gray fines. She found someone in Hollister (\$75 cubic square yard, but will deliver for free.) Local sources were much more expensive. More fines are needed for the back of sheds and around the garden.

H. Rodent Control and Plot Repair

Got Gophers has been catching one or two gophers each time they come out now (twice a month). Gophers are being trapped with no poison and removed from our property by Got Gophers.

I. Board Member Selection, Correspondence Mary Kellogg

We have had a number of inquiries about joining our garden, so there has been correspondence between them, me, Bill, Martha, and Mary W. An email was sent out to all people who previously requested plot information but didn't register. Several replied and registered, but if others are not heard from they will be considered not interested anymore and deleted from our email. We received an email from Leadership Morgan Hill. Many gardeners have come and done some good work. Those that have needed plot repair have been communicated with and work has begun by Dana and Mary Kellogg. (Plots 22, 23, 24, 25, 27, so far). Some gardeners with special talents have been communicated with for special work day tasks, like creating the new sign at the street entrance, website and Facebook updates, IT help with garden email. Board meeting notification and new year 2025 information and reminders went out.

B. Our City Forest CalFire- tree grant Mary W., Action OCF will have a crew to dig holes, advertised on EventBrite to MH, 3 people per tree. 28 trees. Gardeners are excited we are getting trees. Some wanted fruit trees, but we will not be planting and caring for fruit, and there was a concern about watering. Option- water bags (\$8 for a 20 gallon bag, 100 foot hose less than \$70 dollars..) Existing trees have drip. A concern is where is the water source. Mary W will ask Chris Ghione if the City has water piping info. Charlie will look at the drip system to determine if that could be used as an easier option.

C. Irrigation at garden and health of trees

We had a request from a San Jose resident for a plot because they were having a hard time getting in touch with San Jose Community Gardens. It was noted that the San Jose gardens might be full. Our Garden Policies state that priority will be given to Morgan Hill residents and we asked the City of Morgan Hill for permission to include San Martin and Gilroy people on a year-to-year basis if we do not have a wait list of Morgan Hill residents because they do not have community gardens in their cities. Mary W will ask Chris Ghione if MHUSD school district area or San Jose residents are okay to include with the same restrictions, allowing Morgan Hill residents in when the garden is full and having gardeners from other cities give up their plots.
